The Rep is clearly terrified, so the old farmer immediately throws down his tools, runs to the fence and yells at the top of his lungs 'Your card! Show him Your card!'

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ANDY & JESSIE GATT'S CULTURE NOTES FOR HARDCANE DENDROBIUMS TAKEN FROM ANDY'S PRESENTATION AT OCTOBER MEETING, 2010

1. We use deep pots (not squat pots) to suit plant size and plants are all hanging on barbed wire to stop them banging into each other in the breeze.
2. **Repotting tips** - whenever a plant is moved to a new pot, the base of plant is sprayed with Yates Anti-Rot and the top of the plant is sprayed with Scale spray.

Repotting mix – 50% medium cocopeat (from Tinonee Nursery), 20% small pine bark (from Turtle Nursery, Windsor Rd, Rouse Hill – called small playground bark) 10% perlite, 10% polystyrene, 10% German Peat (Lithuanian Peat) from Elders at Windsor)

3. **The Shadehouse** – has an open front facing North. To the rear is a colourbond fence which holds heat. On Western side is a toilet, on Eastern side is 30% shadecloth, which rolls up when needed (if too cold in Winter or too hot in Summer). Shadehouse has a gravel floor and roof is corrugated fibreglass (smoke colour).

4. **Watering** – In Summer Jessie waters 3-4 times a week, due to the open potting mix used (and to lower the temperature surrounding the orchids as well!)

5. **Fertilizing** – done each weekend, using 9 litre watering can. **First weekend** – 1 level teaspoon Peters Excell and 1 tablespoon Fish Emulsion – **alternate weekends** – 1 level teaspoon Peters Excell again and 1 level teaspoon Sulphate of Potash.

Tip – to mix powdered fertilizer, put measured amount in 1 litre clear plastic bottle/container, shake well, let it settle, then shake again if there are still granules on the bottom. Using warm water could make powder break down faster.

6. **Spraying** – give Trace Elements every 4-5 weeks at a rate of one level teaspoon to 9 litres of water (fill spoon with powder then run finger across and level it off). In between, we spray insecticide, either Pest Oil and Malathion or Eco-Oil and Malathion. Spray leaves, stem and roots.
