From the President's Desk

Next Meeting – Tuesday 22nd February 2011 (7.30pm start)

As you would have noted from the front page, we now have an earlier start time to our meetings. This was discussed by the members at the last meeting and ratified by Committee. The hall will now be opened around 7.00pm, so the tables and chairs can be set up - and the display plants benched and (hopefully) placed in the correct classes. The main meeting will now start at 7.30pm, with us aiming to finish no later than 10.00pm. (We must vacate the premises by 10.15pm in any case.)

I will be showing a PowerPoint Presentation of our recent (January 2011) trip to the North Island of New Zealand. The talk will feature some of the summer-flowering orchid species and hybrid orchids grown by the locals and displayed at the Taranaki Orchid Society's Summer Show and Workshop which was an outstanding event. I will also show a few of the NZ native orchids.

Benching Classes at Meetings

Most of the plants exhibited at our meetings are placed in the correct classes. Many are fairly obvious, whilst others can sometimes be confusing. If unsure, see me or any of the committee members who should be able to point you in the right direction. The area where most uncertainty exists seems to be the species and miscellaneous classes, as well as the Australian native sections. I aim to do a quick check 5 or so minutes before the meeting starts, so all is ready for the judges.

Please also ensure that all details (Plant name, class number, owner's name) are completed on the benching slips, so to make it easier when collating the results that go towards our annual point-score competition.

Last Meeting

I did a PowerPoint Presentation on "North Queensland Orchid Adventures" at the last meeting that focused on my most recent trip in October 2010 to the wet tropics. Sadly, many of the areas visited have been subsequently severely damaged by Cyclone Yasi. Keith was a happy treasurer after telling members that 2010 was the first year that PDOS has made a profit in over a decade!

Softcane Dendrobiums

Keith showed off the outstanding growth he has with his own softcane Dendrobium seedlings, between two of his best yellow hybrids. He puts a lot of this growth down to three factors, giving the seedlings strong light, watering them frequently – **sometimes** twice a day in warm weather, - and now the secret! Keith was recommended to use the product Clonex by Ray Clement at the rate of 1 ml per litre. It is available through Tinonee Orchids, and Ray will have it at the next HDO Open Day.

Stanhopea wardii "var. aurea"

One of our newer members, Marga Zanetich brought in one of the most splendidly grown and flowered stanhopeas I have seen at an orchid meeting. The leaves were large, dark green and spotless, on top of huge bulbs! There were lots of flowers, with some buds still coming, and a few spike had already finished and been cut off. Amazingly, this was Marga's first orchid she has benched at PDOS, so she has set an extremely high standard. By the way, this species from Venezuela may be undescribed. It is often seen under the name of Stanhopea wardii var. aurea, however it has a different shape, fragrance and flowering time to the more common species.

Tuesday 22nd March 2011 Meeting – Annual General Meeting: (7.30pm start)

March is our AGM, and we will have at least one vacancy on Committee that will need filling. We will also have David Butler from Green Vista Orchids travelling down from the Central Coast to talk to us about Sarcochilus orchids and some of the hybrids he has developed over the years.
